The frustration of the fraud (8:14-24)	Some who look genuine aren't!
Inclusion or second work of grace?	Certainty of salvation is God's business.
Suspect response	Some who fear they aren't genuine, are.
How do you identify a fraud? They:	
1. Exalt someone other than Christ (9-10)	New believers can quickly revert to the acts of the old nature.
2. Exercise a counterfeit power (11)	Take it Home
