## PRAISE IS AN <u>ATTITUDE</u> ADJUSTER.

NOT = Positive Mental Attitude – you take control

Praise focuses on what you **cannot** control.

Praise is an act of **dependence** 

Praise is an act of **faith** 

Circumstances seek to strangle us into the earthly.	Praising God in and for the "prison experiences" liberates us to <b>rest</b> in his provision.
Praise lifts us to live in the reality of <b>heaven</b> .	
Psalm 34:1-4	PRAISE OPENS DOORS TO MINISTRY. (16:25-40)
⇒ Too often we wait to praise until the trial is over and we see the <u>resolution</u> . (see Ps 103:1-6)	Other prisoners (25-26)
	Jailer (27-34)
Praise pulls me to actively apply the unchanging character of God to my vacillating <u>experience</u> .	Magistrates (35-39)
	Believers in Lydia's house (40)
⇒ Praise is an offering that includes <u>sacrifice</u> !	
Hebrews 13:15 let us continually offer up a <b>sacrifice</b> of praise to God	Living in active praise for everything, doors of ministry can open for us, too!
PRAISE IS A PATH OF <u>PROVISION</u> . (16:25-26)	
	What is the place of praise in your life?
Others also <u>benefit</u>	
At times, praising God in our situations seems naturally <b>outrageous</b> , but is part of God's provision.	Where is God prompting you to praise this morning?

God's deliverance, including the  $\underline{\text{timing}}$ , is always perfect according to his eternal plan.
