Study Questions

1 Peter 3:13-16

- 1. **Read 1 Peter 3:13-16.** Peter asks a question in v. 13: "Who is going to harm you if you are eager to do good?" What is the answer to his question? **Hint**: Be sure to consider verses 14, 16, 17, 18.
- 2. According to the following verses, in what ways does God interact with us when we suffer?

2 Corinthians 1:3-5

Hebrews 12:7

3. What is the relationship between what we now suffer, and the future that awaits us?

Romans 8:18

1 Peter 5:10

- 4. We are encouraged in 1 Peter 3:15 to be "ready to give a reason for the hope that we have". If it is true (and it is) that our hope is a "solid and settled assurance in the outcome of a situation," then what is the reason for this hope?
- 5. In these verses, Peter gives several guidelines for sharing our hope with others. List each guideline you find in verses 15-16, and the reason it would be important to follow.
- 6. What makes a gentle and respectful person an effective witness? (v.15)
- 7. **Read Romans 8:18-39**, noticing all of the wonderful promises that are yours as a believer.
- 8. What role does a close circle of Christian friends play in our ability to endure suffering?
- 9. What are some ways that you can prepare yourself for the suffering that God may allow in your life?
