## Suggested Discussion Questions for 3/20/2022 Message: Instruments of Righteousness (Romans 6:1-14)

- 1. How would you summarize the highlights of what Paul has taught us in the first 5 chapters of Romans?
- 2. What stands out to you in the series of questions that opens Romans 6? Why do you think Paul addressed the themes through questions rather than statements?
- 3. Water baptism is designed to picture our salvation an outward symbol of our internal transformation. How would you explain the picture to a new believer asking you about baptism?
- 4. What difference does it make that we <u>died</u> with Christ? How does this differ from those who say things like "just pick a better path?"
- 5. If you have not been baptized, would this be a good time? Is there a good reason not to?
- 6. If you have been baptized, how has this picture encouraged you in your growth in Christ?
- 7. In verses 11-14 we find a series of commands. What are they? What does each contribute to your understanding of how we live out "newness of life" in Christ?
- 8. How do you (or could you) actively practice "reckoning yourself dead to sin and alive to God?
- 9. Read Colossians 3. In that chapter, how does Paul deal with this concept? What things does he add that aids or increases your understanding?
- 10. If sin is not our ruler, why do we so readily succumb to its reign? How does getting a clear grip on our identity in Christ help us in the process of embracing the reign of Christ in us? (Also consider how this underscores the importance of baptism.)
- 11. What is one practical step you can take this week to live out this passage?
