## Open

- 1. If someone close to you displayed a lack of knowledge about an important subject you knew well, what would you <u>normally</u> do about it?
- 2. If you were trying to convince a friend to change their mind and believe in what you were saying, how would you determine the tone of voice you would use?

## **Explore -- Read Galatians 3:1-5.**

- 3. How would you describe Paul's "tone of voice" here? What reasons might he have for taking this tone with the Galatians?
- 4. How many rhetorical questions do you see in verses 1-5?
- 5. What rhetorical question did he ask in 3:2? How do you think Paul expected the Galatians to answer this question?
- 6. Based on Paul's second question to these believers (3:3), in what way(s) did the Galatians think that the Law could help them?
- 7. Why do you think Paul asked them if their suffering had been for nothing? (3:4)
- 8. What would be the answer to the question in verse 5? (See Ephesians 1:13-14)

9. What are some ways you might help new (or confused) Christians get a clear understanding of their position in Christ and their walk?
