Msg. #15 - The Life Lived under Grace -Galatians 5:5-6

Scriptures Referenced in Message: Galatians 5:5-6; Philippians 1:6; Hebrews 10:14; 6:17-20; 1 Peter 1:13; Romans 7:4-6; 1 John 3:2-3.

5 Bu 6 Fo	Week's Text: Galatians 5:5-6 (NIV) ut by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only that counts is faith expressing itself through love.
1.	What contrasts do you see between the person who falls from Grace into Law-keeping (Verses 2-4), and the person who continues to walk under Grace? (Verses 5-6)
2.	Romans 5:1 says that we who have believed have already been declared righteous ("Justified"). How would you explain the <i>apparent</i> contradiction between Romans 5:1, which says we <i>have</i> righteousness, and Galatians 5:5, which says we are <i>waiting</i> in faith and hope <i>for</i> righteousness?
3.	What reasons do we have to wait for righteousness "eagerly"?
4.	What do you think it means to "wait for righteousness in <u>Hope</u> "?
5.	From verse 6 (and looking at the present context), how would you explain to someone how in Christ Jesus "neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value"?
